1402 - Relational Bullying: What is it and what can we do about it as educators and parents?

Description: Relational bullying is a type of female bullying that is hidden from adults and often more harmful than other forms of bullying. This class is a book review on, "Odd Girl Out" by Rachel Simmons. We will focus on defining relational bullying and understanding the affects on children and their families. We will also explore strategies for preventing and reacting to incidents of relational bullying both for educators and parents.

1400 - Math Strategies to Implement the Common Core, Grades 4-8

1404 - Going Google: Using Google to Create a Classroom Web Site

Description: This workshop is designed for participants who desire their own classroom Web site, but don't know where to begin. Using free Google products and cloud computing, participants will create a practical Web site for student, parent, and teacher use. By creating a Gmail account and first learning about Google Docs, participants will gain knowledge of the building blocks required for creating a Google Site. They will engage in exercises and activities to assist them in learning how to go Google. Next, participants will begin the process of creating their own individual site by using Google Sites. There will be an active demonstration on how to more effectively search the Internet for items such as clip art as well as how to insert images, videos, attachments, and links into one's Web site. While not necessary, it is recommended that before attending the workshop, participants should have a general idea of what they would like to include in their classroom Web site and bring along any electronic documents, images, or resources they would

1405 - "Smart" Ways to Use Interactive Boards in Elementary Classrooms

Description: This class will help teachers understand how easy it is to incorporate interactive (SMART Board) lessons into an elementary classroom. Learn how you can use an interactive board to start your morning meeting, reading lessons, math (Everyday Math) lessons, and review games.

ONLINE COURSES
