
Cloverleaf High School Academic Challenge Team

On Friday, February 22, the 27th Annual Medina County High School Academic Challenge League Tournament was held at the Medina County University Center. Participating in the event were stellar academic students from Brunswick, Buckeye, Cloverleaf, Columbia (Lorain County), Highland, Medina, Revere (Summit County), and Wadsworth. The tournament champion, winning, seven rounds of play, was Revere High School.

The same eight schools which participated in the league tournament had previously matched wits four times in meets throughout the school year for regular season play. Cloverleaf High School's varsity team was the winner of the regular season of the Medina County Academic Challenge League. Revere's JV team took top honors in the junior varsity competition. Both the Revere and the Cloverleaf varsity teams will advance to compete in the regional Academic Challenge tournament, which will be held on Saturday, April 20, at Cloverleaf High School.

### **RoboFest Competition**



Robofest is a competition of autonomous robots that encourages students to have fun while learning principles of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). Top teams from this competition advance to the Regional Robofest Competition and potentially to the World Robofest Competition, both held at Lawrence Technological University in Southfield, Michigan.

On Saturday, March 23, from 8 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., Robofest will be held at the Medina County University Center (MCUC). Students from

around the county will be competing to see who can build, program, and operate their robots with precision and accuracy.

Last year, Robonerds from the Claggett Middle School advanced to the Regional Robofest Competition in Southfield, Michigan.
