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CPR/AED Training

On Saturday, May 25, 2013, the Medina County Schools' ESC is offering CPR/AED training classes with American Heart Association instructors. The class is offered either online or face-to-face. The face-to-face class will be held from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the lower level conference room at 124 W. Washington St., Medina.

The cost of the class is \$55, which includes instruction on what to do in case of choking for all ages, Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), and use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). Along with the instructional aspect, you will receive a course completion card that is good for two years. For an additional cost, you can purchase the American Heart Association student workbook and DVD at the time of the class.
