Mathematics

1286 - Oh No, Not Another Story: Math Strategies for Grades 5-9

Description: Mathematics should and can be fun for both students and teachers. Often we get so wrapped up in testing and covering standards that we lose sight of our love of mathematics and desire to instill that love in our students. This workshop will provide teachers with strategies that will enable them to not only increase their students' ability to conceptualize and retain mathematical content knowledge, but also allow them to share their enjoyment of mathematics with their students. 1. **Application Paper:** Provide a paper describing the application of your class to your current job/classroom.
 - Minimum four pages,
 - Typed, double-spaced, AND
 - Minimum three lesson plans in addition to the four-page application paper.
2. **Research Paper:** Provide a paper describing further current research of your class. Topic must be current beyond the syllabus/topic of the online coursework.
 - Minimum five content pages plus bibliography.
 - Typed, double-spaced.
 - Minimum five reference citations.
3. **Project Paper:** Provide a paper describing further projects with accompanying lesson plan(s) you could develop and/or recommend from your class. Projects must be original and unique beyond the syllabus/topic of the online coursework.
 - Minimum five pages (which includes both project and lesson plan).
 - Typed, double-spaced.
 - Minimum two projects with one or two lesson plans for each project. (The project describes the overall proposed activity, and each project may have one or two lesson plans to accompany it. The lesson plan[s] should describe the specific implementation of the project through a unique lesson.)

4. **Computer Basics:** Provide a copy of one of the projects you developed during the course of your class. Choose the option appropriate to the course for which it is being submitted.
 - PowerPoint - minimum 20 slides.
 - Computer Basics/Integrated Software - minimum three projects or applications.
5. **Computer Basics:** COMBINE one project you developed during the course of your class with an application paper describing how you will/can incorporate the project into your current job/classroom.
 - PowerPoint - minimum five slides.
 - Computer Basics/Integrated Software - minimum one project or application.
 - Application Paper - minimum three pages typed, double-spaced.
6. **Specific Written Assignment:** If you prefer, selected classes are available with a specific, 10 question assignment paper available from Medina ESC (upon request to Dan Vincent at dvincent@medina-esc.org). Each question is related to information presented in the class, and requires a total of approximately 6-12 typed, double-spaced pages. The answers require both content mastery and application of knowledge. Available classes are identified in the description as **WRITTEN ASSIGNMENT AVAILABLE** for final project.

QUIZZES

Each lesson ends with a short, multiple-choice quiz. These are designed to test your comprehension of the course material. When you complete a quiz, you will receive an instant analysis of your work. In order to get the most out of your class, you are encouraged to complete all of the quizzes. To qualify for semester hours, you must complete no less than ten quizzes with a minimum passing rate of 80% per quiz. You may re-take the quiz as many times as necessary to achieve a passing score.

GUIDELINES:

- Assignments must be received by the Medina County Schools' Educational Service Center no later than thirty (30) days after the close of the class. After thirty days a grade of IP (In Progress) will be assigned.
