Fifth-Grade Environmental Retreat



On Tuesday, May 5, the fifth-grade gifted students from Buckeye, Cloverleaf, Highland, and Wadsworth spent the day at the Buffalo Creek Retreat learning about the environment. John Hurt, the "Bugman," met with the students and discussed topics such as the insect life cycle, camouflage, mimicry, rainforest conservation, and butterfly farming during his presentation. He also gave students the opportunity to explore the extensive collection of butterflies and other insects he brought with him as part of his display. During the event, students also had the opportunity to plant trees and shrubs on-site, create seed art and write poetry and

letters in honor of Mother's Day, and graph the amount and type of garbage produced in the students' homes.

Each year the fifth-graders take on the "can creation challenge" and build a model of a living thing using only empty pop cans and duct tape. This year's team winners came from Highland with their model penguin and from Wadsworth with their scorpion entry.

Alternative High School Update

The Virtual Learning Academy (VLA) and the Alternative High School programs both experienced success in the 2008-2009 school year. Twenty students from three high schools (Cloverleaf, Highland, and Buckeye) participated in the Alternative High School program, with eight students taking advantage of courses offered by the VLA. Eight students will earn enough high school credits to graduate this year.

At the Alternative School/VLA, the curriculum is online and available 24 hours a day. Teachers receive students' work quickly and provide timely feedback to questions and ideas. Physical education credit may also be obtained through such activities as basketball, bowling, hiking, and Frisbee golf. Student referrals are made through the home school with the assistance of a counselor or principal.

Next year's schedule (2009-2010) will be a four-hour morning session. Students will be able to use the afternoons to work at part-time jobs and earn work-study credit.

"Catch a Glimpse of a Culture"

Understanding and appreciating people from different cultures is a great skill to develop in our students. During the first few weeks of May, over 20 culture presentations were given in the Wadsworth and Medina City school systems.

Mrs. Sheryl Menke, the English as a Second Language Instructor, began with a short introduction to cultural appreciation using Tongan costume, customs, and language. Bilingual students each had a short talk about their home country and taught their classmates basic language phrases and words (numbers and colors). The languages represented were German (Austria), Telegu (India), Arabic (Yemen), Chinese, Russian, Punjabi (India), Spanish (Mexico and Puerto Rico), Gujurati (India), Italian, Serbian, and Bosnian. Many of the parents came to assist with the language presentation. Many also brought native foods from their home countries. The classroom teachers and students were highly motivated and participated enthusiastically in the presentations.

Special thanks to the many teachers and administrators who were good sports in donning traditional costumes for that day. It added a sense of festivity and showed the students that participation in other cultures' traditions can be fun. Our school systems are enriched by our bilingual population, as shown by these presentations that gave our students a unique lesson at the end of this school year.
