


2021 Spring Online Courses



Need hours to renew your teaching license?

The Educational Service Center of Medina County offers graduate credit for online courses. You can receive either one or two semester hours per class from Ashland University; 2.4 CEUs are also available.

There are two ways to learn! In our **instructor-led courses**, you study and interact with a cohort over a six-week schedule. Courses start monthly with twice-weekly lesson plans. For the independent learner, our **self-paced courses** also start monthly. You have access to all lessons immediately and have up to three months to complete each course. You can take any of these courses from the comfort of your home or office at the times that are most convenient for you.

OACAC and StriveScan partnered to host virtual college fairs in February and March 2021.

StriveScan offered **"6x6" Virtual College Fairs** on February 23-24 and March 24-25. A wide range of post-secondary options were presented in a lively, safe environment via Zoom Webinars. The format was designed to closely replicate an in-person college fair browsing experience. Six colleges made up a group, and each college presented for six minutes. Students were able to ask questions via chat. Each group sessions lasted 45 minutes, and several group sessions ran concurrently each hour.

Additionally, a number of **information panels** were presented by OACAC member institutions on March 8, 9, and 10. One or two representatives from each institution served as panelists for an hour-long block of time, and several institutions presented together. For each information panel, a period of 45 minutes was set aside for students to ask questions.

Students, parents, and counseling professionals attended free of charge.
