Substitute Services

ESCMC continues to provide substitute services as part of the North Coast Shared Service Alliance (NCSSA). This summer, the East Central Ohio Educational Service Center (ECOESC) joined NCSSA and will offer substitute services to schools in Belmont and Tuscarawas Counties. Because NCSSA is based primarily in northern Ohio, a train-thetrainer model has been developed. Personnel from ESCMC trained clerical and administrative personnel from ECOESC



to on-board substitute teachers using NCSSA's orientation program, to use Frontline Technology's Aesop substitute management system, and to train substitutes who are not educators using the NCSSA Safe and Engaged program. NCSSA services will thus be offered in the southeastern part of the state, while travel on the part of NCSSA personnel has been minimized and substitutes' contact with secretaries and administrators with whom they are familiar will be maximized. Job Fair

The Personnel Department is coordinating the second annual ESCMC Job Fair to be held on Wednesday, August 2, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the main branch of the Medina County District Library on the square in downtown Medina. At the job fair, participants will be able to discuss potential employment opportunities with directors and staff from substitute services, nursing, transportation, and special needs departments. Assistance with completing job applications, setting up Ohio Department of Education (ODE) SAFE accounts, and applying for ODE licenses and permits will also be provided.



In addition to the August Job Fair, throughout the school year the department conducts on-site job fairs for Medina County districts in need of substitute teachers. These job fairs target parents and others with "vested interest" in their local school communities as potential substitute teachers. Like the summer fair, the local job fairs allow potential substitute teachers to complete a job application, participate in a pre-employment interview, and complete license applications and other pre-employment paperwork in a single evening at a site in their local school districts.
