School Bus Safety Road-E-O

The North Region School Bus Safety Road-E-O was held on April 22 at Buckeye Local Schools. Two Medina County school bus drivers placed high enough to qualify for the state competition, which was held on May 6 in Galloway, Ohio. At the State School Bus Safety Road-E-O, the North Region team came in first place, and Steve Temple from Buckeye Local came in second place, thus earning a spot at



the International School Bus Road-E-O that will take place in July in Indianapolis, Indiana. The School Bus Safety Road-E-O is a friendly competition that consists of a written test as well as a maneuverability course.

It is designed to encourage those involved in school transportation to enhance their knowledge of transporting those with special needs. "Positive Interactions" focuses on teaching vital tools that can be used to promote a safe environment and encourage positive interactions during times of difficulty.
