

Four students received scholarships from the Medina County Art League, and eight other students received awards from the Educational Service Center of Medina County. Janet Baran, Medina County Art League Scholarship Committee Chair, stated, "The four judges, who have over 140 collective years in art education, were impressed with the depth and artistic abilities that were presented by these high school seniors. Their job was challenging, to say the least. There were many portfolios exhibiting several strong works. The students who have been selected to receive awards have shown technical excellence in a chosen media, consistency in the work, and a distinct 'voice' carried throughout. Congratulations to all of you who entered and the teachers and parents who have supported and inspired you."

High school seniors who are students of Medina County visual arts teachers were eligible to participate. Scholarship portfolios, non-scholarship portfolios, and individual entries were accepted. Artwork was to be original, school appropriate, and created in conjunction with school assignments. Portfolios were to contain five pieces of art showing a diversity of talent. For students entering portfolios, the format is similar to a graduating art major in college who is required to hold a senior show.
