High School Academic Challenge League

The Medina County High School Academic Challenge League's season is well underway! Participating in this year's league are both varsity and junior varsity teams from Black River Local, Brunswick City, Buckeye Local, Highland Local, Revere Local, and Wadsworth City Schools. This year's schedule includes meets in the months of October, November, and December. Team points, which accumulate over the regular season's competition nights, will result in a Medina County High School Academic Challenge League champion. In January, the varsity teams will compete in a one-day tournament that will result in a tournament champion. Winning teams from both the regular season and the league tournament will qualify to participate in the Ohio Academic Competition Regional Tournament, which will be held in April of 2019.

School Nursing



A Nursing Services staff meeting was held on Friday, October 12. Guest speaker Laurie Wingenroth, from the Cleveland Clinic Endocrinology Dept., THE BLEED presented Diabetic Education. She brought many different types of insulin pumps for staff to work with. Lori Hoque, Director of Nursing Services, also educated the staff on "STOP the Bleed." This course demonstrates how to

properly apply tourniquets and pack wounds in emergency situations to stop life-threatening bleeding. This can save people's lives!!

Nursing Services presented to the ESCMC Governing Board at its October meeting. They reviewed the basics of the "STOP the Bleed" program with them. The Nursing Services Department also received over \$3,600 worth of free vision equipment from Wise About Eyes for vision training. They demonstrated this equipment to the Governing Board members as well.

An upcoming Safe Sitter class will be held at the Educational Service Center of Medina County on Saturday, November 3. The following topics will be covered: 1) safety skills, 2) childcare skills, 3) first aid and rescue skills, and 4) life and business skills. Each participant receives a Safe Sitter course completion card.

School Nursing always offers CPR courses to staff and the public. Courses include Heartsaver First Aid, CPR, AED; Heartsaver CPR, AED; and Basic Life Support.

Nursing staff members continue to complete vision and hearing screening on their students following Ohio Department of Health guidelines.
