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School Nursing

Nursing staff members have attended the open houses at their schools as well as prepared their clinics for the start of the year. The nurses' duties will begin by processing medications and emergency plans needed for students in the schools. Nurses also verify that all immunizations are up to date for kindergarten students and any students new to the district. New this school year will be the implementation of the recently updated Ohio Department of Health vision and hearing changes. These include 11th grade vision and hearing for students who participate in high noise exposure events, such as band.

A Safe Sitter class will be held at the Educational Service Center of Medina County on October 6, 2018. The following topics in the updated curriculum will be covered: 1) safety skills, 2) childcare skills, 3) first aid and rescue skills, and 4) life and business skills. Each participant receives a Safe Sitter course completion card.

The School Nursing Department always offers CPR courses to staff and the public. Courses include Heartsaver First Aid, CPR, AED; Heartsaver CPR, AED; and Basic Life Support.

Director of Nursing Lori Hoque is now a trained instructor for "Stop the Bleed." This course teaches civilians basic training in bleeding control. "The only thing more tragic than a death from bleeding. . . is a death that could have been prevented." www.bleedingcontrol.org

Motivating the Unmotivated Learner: Proven Instructional Strategies

ONLINE



Description: This self-paced online course will focus on strategies to motivate struggling students--both those who are "a-literates" (they don't like to read) and those who are struggling with basic skills. Strategies will be shared focusing on ideas to be done before, during, and after the teaching of a unit. These strategies are hands-on, and can be implemented quickly and easily in all content areas. Participants will gain a toolkit of ideas and strategies that will motivate even the most unmotivated reader.

One (1) Graduate Credit Hour will be available at the cost of \$162 through Kent State University. Once your enrollment is processed, you will receive a link with instructions on registering for Kent credit. The assignment for graduate credit is to choose one or a combination of the strategies and create an outline of a plan to incorporate them into a unit that you already teach. First, you will need to describe the overarching goals of your unit and why it is so challenging to get your students motivated to learn. Then you will need to provide a description of the lessons you will teach that incorporate some of the strategies you will learn during the course. The entire document you submit should be three to five pages in length.
