The American Heart Association's "Go Red for Women" movement and its latest Hispanic movement, "Go Red Por Tu Corazón," work to beat heart disease, the number-one killer of women. Each year cardiovascular diseases claim the lives of nearly half a million women—almost one per minute. On February 7 people across the nation were encouraged to show their support by wearing red on National Wear Red Day for thousands of women who are choosing to reduce their personal risk for heart disease.

It may not be at the top of most women's to-do lists, but caring for your heart through a healthy diet and regular physical activity is the secret weapon to preventing heart disease. North Coast Shared Services Alliance (NCSSA)

The North Coast Shared Services Alliance (NCSSA), a four-partner shared services consortium which includes MCSESC, the Educational Service Center of Lorain County, the Cuyahoga County Educational Service Center, and Rachel Wixey and Associates, continues to experience success at the end of its first year in existence. NCSSA employs more than 700 substitutes who are placed in 12 districts. Almost 100 percent of the member districts who used Aesop in the past are experiencing increased substitute fulfillment rates with NCSSA.

This spring teachers in several districts will be notified of the need to update licenses and background checks, which will be available on-site with each participating district

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Summer Enrichment Program

Planning has begun for our second year of Summer Enrichment at the ESC. The Summer Enrichment Program is for middle school age students who would benefit from a structured and relevant small-group environment with a focus on building personal and social confidence. Our program is structured to provide students who struggle with social situations a vehicle to practice social skills within a small-group setting and opportunities to generalize those skills in the community. The six-week program is classroom-based three days per week and community-based one day per week. Instruction is focused on “learning by doing” and features real-life social situations. Students will have the opportunity to work with an intervention specialist, BCBA, speech, and occupational therapist. Enrollment is open.
