Personnel—Substitute Services

Last spring, the Medina County Schools' Educational Service Center (MCSESC) joined the North Coast Shared Services Alliance (NCSSA), a four-partner consortium that includes our ESC, the Educational Service Center of Lorain County, the Cuyahoga County Educational Service Center, along with Rachel Wixey and Associates.

Each month our staff conducts substitute teacher orientation training sessions at both Cuyahoga and Lorain County Educational Service Centers. Our team's goal is make sure all substitutes have a smooth transition into the NCSSA. During the orientation, a PowerPoint presentation shared with all in attendance. This presentation addresses standard hiring forms, the schedule management tools, what to expect from

attending the session, and any questions. Also, at this orientation our team processes each individual substitute's paperwork and ensure that applicants meet employment requirements for the Alliance.

Online Anytime School Program



The Medina County Schools' Educational Service Center (MCSESC) continues to offer opportunities in online education around the clock and around the year. Students wishing to recover credits, enrich their education, or simply get ahead may wish to investigate what we have to offer through our Online Anytime Program. Students may also choose from 49 full- or half-credit courses to take in all the major subjects in order to fill in their high school schedules if they find themselves locked out of a required course.

Our program also offers education in a classroom setting with our MCSESC Alternative School. We currently have six students working in our on-site lab. Four are from Medina, and we have one each from Cloverleaf and Buckeye. These students attend our school from 8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. under the direction and instruction of certified teachers.

Alternative School students work towards recovering credits and early graduation, which most of the students achieve.

Special Needs Initiatives

M any exciting things have been happening in the Special Needs Initiatives department. Christina Combs, our behavior specialist, has been busy providing consultation services, Crisis Prevention Institute (CPI) trainings, and facilitating social skills groups throughout the districts in Medina and Summit Counties. Cristina has gone as far as Mansfield to provide CPI training to the Mid-Ohio Educational Service Center as well!

Our first Interpreter Forum of the school year was held recently and attended by many American Sign Language (ASL) interpreters from our area. The Medina County Schools' Educational Service Center (MCSESC) is planning another exciting opportunity for our interpreters coming up on November 8. It is entitled "Transition for Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Students: Preparing for Kindergarten and Post-Secondary Success."

The Special Education Forum has been well attended thus far, with presentations on Individual Educational Plan/Evaluation Team Report (IEP/ETR) compliance as well as a legal update. The next forum will focus on Least Resistant Environment (LRE) in preschool. Rachael Krauss, Director of Special Needs Initiatives, is planning several professional development opportunities for our districts and hopes to have updates soon. The MCSESC will be hosting the first Preschool Supervisors' Meeting November 7.

Recently Rachael Krauss attended the Special Education Leadership Conference in Columbus, where the dynamic speakers focused on topics including executive functioning, districtwide autism teams, and increasing reading competency in our students. Also, Rachael facilitated an Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) in the classroom presentation and will be presenting on SART (Strategy Assessment Revision Tool). She also has been providing services as a BCBA (Board Certified Behavior Analyst) in Mayfield. Finally, in Rachael's busy schedule she managed to complete the training as a Resident Educator and an OTES
